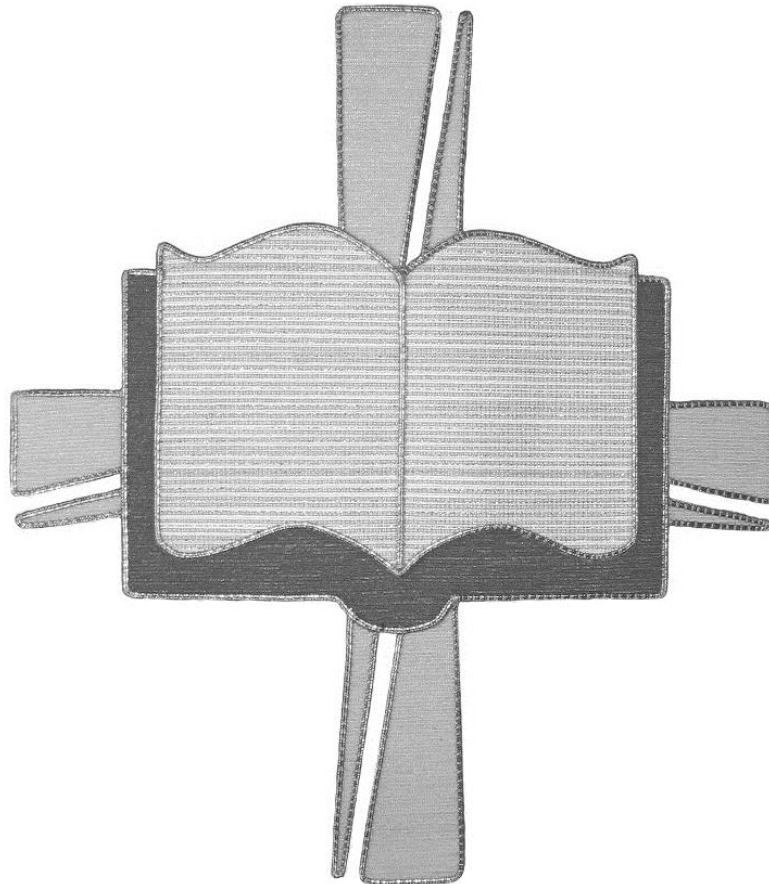

TODAY AT NEW ST. JAMES
We welcome you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

WELCOME

- We invite guests and visitors to use the blue welcome cards in the pew racks, and the Friendship Book in the narthex.

PARKING

- On Sunday mornings, the Oxford Street parking lot is for handicapped parking and for drop offs only. Please do not park in the laneway into the parking lot - this is a fire access route. Parking is available on all surrounding streets and at our good neighbours:

WASHROOMS

- Washrooms are located in the corridor behind the organ chamber, and on the lower and upper levels of the hall. Coat racks are in the narthex and in the corridor behind the organ chamber. Please do not leave valuables unattended.

NURSERY

- Child care for infants and toddlers is provided in the nursery, near the west door of the sanctuary. We invite parents with small children to sit in the front pews on that side.

FOR YOUR SAFETY

- We want to make New St. James a safe and welcoming place for all who come here. Our Church School staff have all received Police Records Checks and training in safety procedures.
- To protect people with nut allergies, our goal is to make New St. James a nut-free facility. Please do not bring nuts of any kind, or anything containing nut products such as peanut butter, into the building. However, we cannot guarantee that cookies served during the fellowship time may not have come in contact with nuts.
- Gluten-free cookies are available during the fellowship time.
- To protect people who are sensitive or allergic to scent, we want to make New St. James scent-free. Please keep this in mind when applying perfume and aftershaves.
- For reasons of personal safety, the front row of the balcony has been closed off.

On Saturday, April 20, about 30 of us came together for the workshop "Leadership Today", led by Dr. David Thompson and Kathy Smit. This was actually about the fifth leadership initiative in the last four years. All of the workshops were great, but nothing came of them. Many of us in business, government and education have experienced energizing retreats and workshops that produced no change. The result often is that the grassroots stop taking appeals for leadership and dynamic growth seriously.

Not this time. Enough training. It is time to build on what we have learned.

David and Kathy walked us through Kennon Callahan's book, *Twelve Keys to an Effective Church*. Callahan has decades of experience helping congregations increase their key strengths and add additional strengths in order to be even more effective mission servants in our world that is full of hopes and hurts. His message is based on our being Easter People, the people of the Open Tomb. Our best years are yet to come and it is up to us to discern what God has planned for us so that we will be able to hand New St. James on to the next generation stronger and more vital than when it was handed on to us.

The Twelve Keys Group will meet a few times in August to study several chapters of Callahan's book and to begin the planning process of preparing New St. James for worship and service well into the 21st century. We intend to have fun doing this work. *If you would like to be part of this exciting time of introspection, analysis and dynamic growth, please contact John Stewart.* All will be welcomed into the team. One last thought: the time of introspection and analysis will be short because we will move to action quickly. This will not be yet another exciting workshop that goes nowhere.
